

#### A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT Drew Lewis

A couple weeks ago I experienced a heartwarming "first" in my sixth year of teaching at my school. The bell rang for lunch and my intermediate Treble Choir insisted that we had to finish singing the song we were working on before they left. This was in the middle of the omicron surge, and something in my students' attitude reminded me of the line in Frank Tichelli's *Earth Song* which says "But music and singing have been my refuge." This has not been an easy year (or almost three years!) to be a teacher or a student, but I have certainly seen a change in my students' reaction to their music classes. After so much time online, my students are so grateful to be making music together in person. And I am grateful to work with them in person as well. Our performances so far this year may not have been the most polished, but I must say they have been some of the most special performances in all of my career after all we've been through.

As we continue to deal with the challenges of COVID-19 and look to a future with no more "surges" or mitigation strategies needed in our schools, I continue to hold on to hope. While I know that so many of us are understandably still in survival mode, I do believe we have brighter days ahead as the Spring arrives. I also believe that SCVA can be a resource to help our programs at whatever stage we are experiencing. We are headed into an exciting festival season this March through May. It is exciting because our Festival Team has worked hard to put together IN PERSON Concert Festivals throughout Southern California for the first time since 2019! Our Vocal Jazz/Gospel/A Cappella Festival on March 24<sup>th</sup> will also be the first in person festival of its kind since 2018! In May we also have our Show Choir Spectacular and Close Harmony Festivals retuning in person as well, and we are co-sponsoring the first ever Elementary Choir Workshop and Concert. There are many wonderful opportunities to help you and your students grow this Spring and I encourage you to get involved however you can!

Sometimes we need something other than student events to keep us going. We need inspiration and a chance to decompress (and also commiserate!) I had a wonderful time connecting with colleagues at the recent CASMEC Conference in Fresno, and I am looking forward to seeing many more of you at the ACDA Western Division Conference in Long Beach. Come by our SCVA booth in the exhibit hall to say hello and pick up some swag. Please tell your colleagues who are not SCVA members to stop by the booth as well – first time members will receive a free membership if they register at the conference. We will also be hosting a reception for SCVA members that weekend so be on the lookout for information!

Finally, in order to get our programs to where they can thrive at the best level they can, it is important that we have the funding arts and music education needs in the state.
