A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Colleagues,

The month of October is an exciting and stressful time for all of us in music. Many of us are having our first concerts of the new school year while some are already participating in local choral festivals. It is important that amidst the field trip forms, transportation requests, performance attire orders, and everything else that our performances are a time to celebrate the great work that we do in our classrooms every day.

Some of the best moments and memories that we have are not the performances but of the serendipitous moments of joy and silliness that comes out of our rehearsal halls. One of my conducting mentors very wisely told me once that "the best memories that we have of choir are most often from the unstructured time together." Be sure to treasure the little spontaneous moments as those are the memories that we will take away for the rest of our and our students' lifetimes. One of my students shared with me before they graduated that the goal of many of my singers was to do something so memorable or funny that they would be the story that I would tell students for many years to come.

Choir is not for those who seek instant gratification. It is a slow labor of love, and we must continually create moments of joy while leaving space for uncontrollable creative energy of our students. Choir culture is also a term that I've heard thrown around quite a bit and I believe it is a misunderstood concept. The culture of your program is exactly how you want it to be and in whatever shape or form you deem it to be. We are the model, the judge, the jury, the laugh track, the disciplinarian, and the parent figure to all our students.

I know when I was still building my fledgling program early in my career, it was always easy to make comparisons to others in the field and be jealous of what they had. None of that matters. All that matters are the students in our room and the experience that we create for them. Those students will bring their friends, siblings, and anyone else they can find that also want to share in that special experience.

Patience and hard work will lead to our collective success as a field. Impatience will lead to stress and ultimately burn out. Keep pressing the refresh button and find moments of serendipity you'd like to share with your students. Try finding a new analogy, a new fact, an observation, a pop-culture question, a poll question, a what-if scenario, a personality test, or whatever it takes to keep the energy fresh in your classroom. Wishing you all a serendipitous October!

Your E-mail Address Matters

When you registered or renewed your annual SCVA Membership, you specified your work or personal e-mail address, both of which are unique to you. In some cases, you might have multiple e-mail address aliases for your school, but you must always standardize on the one that you used for your SCVA Membership.

When your students register to participate in an SCVA event, they should use the same e-mail address that you used when you created or renewed your Annual SCVA Membership. The system validates your e-mail address and verifies that your SCVA Membership Dues have been paid. Our systems will reject any student applications (such as Honor Choirs or Vocal Solo Competition) that don't use your primary e-mail address.

When that happens, the application is discarded and there is nothing that we can do to recover it. Instead, it is your responsibility to ensure that your singers use **ONLY** your primary e-mail address that is associated with your SCVA membership. In addition, when we have application deadlines, we cannot accept a claim that a student used the wrong e-mail address or if they had some Internet connectivity problems. It is as if they had not submitted any application at all. This is another great reason to teach your students that waiting until the last minute to submit their applications is not a very good idea.

On a related note, when your students use that primary email address for their audition applications, you can view all of the applications for your students by logging in to the Members-Only area of the website. You can also view all of your Festival Registrations on that page once we open the Festival Registration process.

Describe the structure of your program: (size, schedule, ensemble voicing):

We currently have 4 choirs - a Treble Chorus (open/non-auditioned treble), Treble Ensemble (intermediate treble), Bass Chorus/Ensemble (open/non-auditioned beginning-intermediate), and Vocal Ensemble (intermediate-advanced mixed SATB). What about your program are you most proud of:

I appreciate and work hard to uphold the mission and vision statements of our program that was created during my 2nd year at FUHS with Vocal Ensemble students.

Our Mission: Students shall not only be life-long learners and enjoyers of vocal music, but will also achieve high standards in musical excellence, professionalism, and character of person.

Our Vision: Each student will gain life skills through their participation in music, preparing them to become gracious and contributing members of a global society.

Favorite repertoire you have recently programed:
