A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Happy December to the hardest working people on earth this month. The weeks between Thanksgiving and New Year are often labeled "The Most Wonderful Time of the Year." For most choral musicians the season started well before *Red Cup day* and will end with us collapsed on the most comfortable flat surface available on January 1st (or December 26th). Whatever your end date, the busy nature of the season leaves many of us struggling to balance our obligations to our music programs and spending time with our loved ones.

Unfortunately, over the years, the ever-increasing demands and expectations of December have become yet another source of stress for too many of us. Let me stop here and say: If you are someone who finds joy in dong all the things each December, by all means, keep doing them, the rest of this message is not meant for you. However, if the stress knocks you back a few steps every year and makes you dread the holiday season, read on.

Essayist, Elizabeth Joyce, has these words of wisdom for us all: "What if I told you, you don't have to do it all this holiday season? Depending on the type of person you are, you might nod in agreement or roll your eyes. Either way, the majority of you will say, "Yeah, BUT..." But it is the holidays. But I need to make it magical. But it is tradition. Here's the thing: You do not need to maintain traditions which no longer bring you joy. If you find yourself feeling overwhelmed for months, it is time to let go of that stress. Do less. In doing so, you may actually recapture the joy of the season."

For those of us in choral music, the traditions run strong through the threads of our programs. Some of those traditions were implemented decades before we started in our positions and others are things we chose to add ourselves. And, while there are many traditions that can (and should) be maintained, many have outlived their tenure.

The post-pandemic classroom may be the perfect time to pare down our personal expectations. Instead of trying to compensate for the losses of the last couple of years, it may be time to spin that to our advantage. Use this year to get back to the basics and find the simple joys in our music again. Remember to step back and decide what is really important about these upcoming performances (and the amount of music/decorations/set pieces) are rarely it.

Festival Aubric

As a festivals team, it has always been our goal to ensure that festivals reflect the mission and values of SCVA. At the conclusion of the 2023 festival cycle, we reviewed feedback from each of our participants. While much of the feedback was positive, an area for improvement that was indicated was in the disparity of scores and the occasionally amorphous nature of ratings. What is a superior choir? What does a superior Class I choir sound like and how is it different from a superior Class II choir?

While SCVA has an adjudication form readily available to all to peruse, we realized we did not have a rubric that outlines specifically what each category represents, but how that looks like per classification. And so, the festival team decided to create a rubric to help streamline our adjudication and create more clarity and consistency throughout. My name is Adrian Rangel-Sanchez, I am the Director of Vocal Music at Portola High School in Irvine, the Director of Music Ministry at Canyon Hills Presbyterian Church, and a current student in the Choral Conducting Masters program at CSU Fullerton. I also completed my BA in Music Education at CSU Fullerton.

Describe the structure of your program: (size, schedule, ensemble voicings):

I have about 150 students split between five choral ensembles in my program this year: beginning SATB, intermediate pop choir, advanced TTBB, advanced SSAA, and advanced SATB. We also have a barbershop quartet and an a cappella group that rehearse after school.

- What about your program are you most proud of:
 I am proud of how much we have grown. I was fortunate
 to be the one to establish and build the choral program
 as Portola was a new school when I was hired in 2017. I
 started with just one choir of freshmen and sophomores,
 and since then we have added so many students and
 ensembles to the program. I am especially proud to have
 3 advanced level ensembles that are able to combine
 into a balanced SATB symphonic chorus and put
 together some amazing choral orchestral works each
 spring.
- Favorite repertoire you have recently programed:
 This year we will be putting together the Faure Requiem in collaboration with our school's orchestra. We have recently also performed some other large scale choral orchestral works including Howard Goodall's Eternal Light: A Requiem, excerpts from Carmina Burana, and the Vivaldi Gloria.
- Tell us about your life outside the classroom:

 I love to bake and cook in my limited spare time. I also love to travel, this summer I spent two months traveling in Korea, Japan, Mexico, Germany, and Spain.
